

HOW TO SAIL IN CHARLESTON





HIGH LEVEL



Those with a good plan and great execution are rewarded.

- Not a speed venue, it's a dynamic racecourse that is always changing!
- Swift tides and shifty winds.





TIDAL CURRENTS

- It takes too long to restart if you're over early – you have to sail up current to clear.
- Don't under or over stand lay lines it can be costly in larger fleets.
- Leave yourself room when rounding marks in strong currents.
- Crab pots are hard to see in rolling tides.
- Low tides reveal new shallow areas.



PRO TIP: It's extra important to keep your head out of the boat and be aware of the fast changes so you can get to the correct side of the tack quickly.






TIDES: MAX EBB








TIDES: MAX FLOOD








TIDES: START OF FLOOD

- Transitional time for the local sea breeze phenomenon
- Consistent Southwesterly materializes around noon
- With strong breeze: inshore race sources can experience large chop, opposite the tidal current, coming out of the East or Northeast


Course 3 and 5 are Windward-Leeward with a finish to Windward.










Course 4 and 6 are Windward-Leeward with a finish to Leeward.





SW 15-20 kts or ESE 6-12 kts




SUMMARY


- High pressures developing around Bermuda on Thursday and Friday will cause a moderate southerly gradient
- Model 1: shows a cold front approaching from the west strengthening the SW wind
- **Model 2:** shows a gradient becoming gentle or moderate Easterlies that could become SE with the local sea breeze effect.






